Communion is observed on the first Sunday of each month.


Church Sunday School is held from September to June and starts at 10:30 AM after the children and teachers leave the Worship Service.

A Message From Rev. Carol Lewis



Greetings from your Pastor. I am sitting in my office looking out on the busy activity of our community. The wind is blowing; the sky has more fluffy white clouds than azure blue patches. There is banging going on across the street at the Dollar Store as a crew works to set a pipe in the ground. I am fascinated watching them work but have no idea what the finished product will be. Guess I'll just have to wait and see.

Waiting and seeing is okay in some cases but in terms of taking care of God's good creation we can no longer wait and see. In a recent sermon I talked about opposing views of how we understand our role—our place—in creation. The world has adopted, for the most part, a consumer attitude and from a faith perspective we are called to be caretakers. We are consuming the earth's resources at a much faster rate then the earth can renew those resources. More importantly some of the resources we consume are not renewable!

From a faith standpoint, our patterns of consumption should reflect values like, peace, fairness, justice, health, community, diversity, and legacy. Availability and access to adequate food, shelter, and security are important for all of God's children.

Congregations are being encouraged to start conversations and the commitments to become Green Congregations. These are conversations I recommend we should endeavor to have. As I said in my sermon, even one small step is a step toward being better stewards of God's amazing gift to us.

So here are a few suggestions that have been put forward by the Environmental Ministries. Some are quirky. Others are worth

thinking about in terms of whether we are consumers or caretakers. The following are questions that can be used to decide whether it is a good quality purchase or a spontaneous "whim."

- Does this purchase add positive value to my life, my home, or my community?
- Does this purchase harm or help the natural environment?
- Could I do without this purchase?
- What else could I spend this money on or could I save it for the future?

Another suggestion is to put your credit cards in water in the freezer. The reason being that it would have to thaw before using and that would give you time to think about whether or not a purchase is a need or a want.

This is a beautiful time of the year when we see the full effect of God's living creation. Let's not wait and see what will happen to this precious balance of life since doing so may lead to the point of no return. We can make a difference, one small step at a time. Have a wonderful summer and find time to relax and enjoy the beauty that surrounds you!
