A Message From Rev. Carol Lewis



Greetings,

As I write this letter, the snowflakes and the sun are competing with one another. Rather than one or the other winning we are left with overcast gray skies once again!! This has been an incredibly cold and snowy winter. I have faith and live in the hope that under all that SNOW lie daffodils, tulips, hyacinths, and forsythia that will herald the start of spring in a few weeks. I can't wait for the earth to come alive again!

We are in our season of Lent—a time of reflection and walking with Jesus in the wilderness of our lives. It is the 40 days—not counting Sundays—that lead up to Easter. We are encouraged to examine our own lives in light of God's love and the ministry of Jesus. The liturgical color is black or purple—the colors of penitence and mourning. At BBCC we use purple. We will have three Lenten lunches with a short program. Our focus this year will be on health and healing.

The last week of Lent begins with Palm Sunday, March 29, 2015. During this week we will walk with Jesus during his final week on Earth. We begin with his triumphal entry into Jerusalem; his teaching and preaching; his last supper with his disciples, his arrest, trial, and crucifixion; and finally our celebration of his resurrection on Easter.

We will honor our church's traditions with the Service of Tenebrae on Maundy Thursday April 2, 2015. On Good Friday we will share in an ecumenical service with First Congregational Church of East Windsor, Grace




