



A Message From Rev. Carol Lewis



It has been busy here at BBCC. There have been several "firsts" observed, which has been exciting. We celebrated Shrove Tuesday a bit early and enjoyed a pancake breakfast during coffee hour. There was great hospitality and community offered as well. This will most likely become an annual entry into our Lenten journey. Another first was BBCC's hosting of the Ecumenical Ash Wednesday Service. There were several participants that had not experienced an Ash Wednesday service and they found it to be most meaningful.

We are in the middle of our "first" survey from Holy Cow Consulting. We expect all returns to be in by March 1, 2016. It is hoped that this instrument will be a catalyst for some transformation here at BBCC. What that transformation will look like is yet to be determined. We are placing our trust in God to open us up to new possibilities and to grant us the wisdom to follow where God is calling us.

We will round out Lent with our last two Lenten lunches on March 6^{th} and 13^{th} .


Our "first" community potluck supper/game night will be held Saturday March 19th beginning at 5 o'clock. Come join us for

First Communion Classes







Recipe Corner

The recipe chosen for this issue of the Beacon was prompted by the -6 degree temperature outside.....Brrrr! I chose this wonderful healthy meatless soup to warm you up from inside out (an all-time favorite any time of the year)! As I sit here typing this recipe, there's a roaring fire going in the fireplace and I am sipping on a Brown Sugar Latte that I tried and loved from a recipe found on Pinterest (I highly



recommend this warm beverage recipe so I will share it as a bonus). This soup is so very flavorful and filling, you won't miss the meat. The dumplings are like icing on the cake!! The recipe does call for canned products which can be high in sodium so be careful there if you are watching your sodium intake. Luckily for me.....I have a master chef in my kitchen who likes to substitute with fresh verses canned! He does substitute to the healthier canned versions to save time on occasion, especially for the beans. They are worth the few cents extra. Sure hope this becomes a staple recipe for you as it has been in my household. Makes great leftovers!

PS: Our grandsons even like this soup!

Tangy Bean Soup with Cornmeal Dumplings: (serves 6)

Soup Ingredients:

- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) chicken broth
- 1 package (16 ounces) frozen mixed vegetables
- 1 can (15 ounces) black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can (15 ounces) pinto beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 can (14-1/2 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 chopped medium onion
- 1TBLS chili powder
- 1 TBLS minced cilantro (original recipe calls for
- fresh but we don't always have that on hand)
- 4 minced garlic cloves
- ¹/₄ tsp ground pepper

<u>In a slow cooker</u>, combine all the soup ingredients, cover and cook on high for 4 to 5 hours. Save the cornmeal dumplings till 30 minutes before intended meal time.

Dumpling Ingredients:

½ cup all-purpose flour
½ cup shredded sharp cheddar cheese (not always used)
1/3 cup cornmeal
1 tbsp sugar
1 tsp baking powder
1 egg
2 tbsp milk
2 tsp canola oil



<u>Dumplings</u>: Combine the flour, cheese, cornmeal, sugar and baking powder in a medium bowl. In another bowl, combine the egg, milk and oil. Add wet to dry ingredients just until moistened (batter will be stiff). Drop by heaping tablespoons onto soup. Cover and cook on high for 30 minutes longer (without lifting the cover). After 30 minutes, test dumplings with a toothpick, it should come out clean.



Happy eaters give a thumbs up!

Brown Sugar Latte (2 servings)

Ingredients:

2 cups freshly brewed coffee (on the stronger side)

2 tbsp caramel sauce (ice cream topping is ok, can be sugar free)

1 cup milk (skim milk ok to make it skinny)

2 tbsp packed light brown sugar (or truvia/stevia brown sugar blends)

whipped cream and caramel sauce for garnish (optional but highly recommended for small splurge!!)



1. Brew your coffee from your automatic coffee machine as usual.

2. In a quart mason jar with a lid (or a glass measuring cup), heat milk combined with the brown sugar in the microwave for 1 minute. If using Mason jar with lid....make sure lid is on tight then shake vigorously for a minute or two until frothy. (If using measuring cup, transfer into a beverage shaker and shake vigorously or use an imerseable mixer for 15-20 seconds).

3. To serve, pour coffee equally into 2 mugs. Add 1 tbsp caramel sauce to each mug, stir to dissolve. Slowly pour frothy milk equally over each coffee. Optional but highly recommended.....add whipped cream and drizzle caramel sauce on cream. Oooh so good! Enjoy!
