



(placed within the garden, along the path, on the mulch) (Leave spaces between words and dates)






# Memorial Garden Nameplate:



# Sweet Peach Tea (Great Hot or Cold!)

In searching for a new recipe for the Beacon, this one caught my eve. Instead of cooking up a storm with entrees or desserts, why not a great beverage to serve up hot or cold for friends and family that may pop in this summer. The weather hasn't been the best so far for iced drinks so this recipe being versatile hot or cold is key. I love drinking *freshly* made tea, hot or cold, and absolutely love anything Peach this time of year! On my next trip to the store after finding this recipe, frozen peaches were on the shopping list, the fresh ones didn't impress me for the money and the added work to peel them! I did pick up some extra packages of the frozen peaches just in case another recipe had to be tested. The recipe is easy and quick to make. The tea was tried while it was still very warm, then was poured over some ice after it cooled down. To complete the taste-test challenge, I poured more over ice in several glasses and served it to my husband and friends, it scored high in complements (better double or triple the recipe though) as we drank it all up in no time. This refreshing sweet peach tea can be enjoyed yearround, so it definitely scored high in my book!! Will definitely pick up some more frozen peaches to have on hand for when company

#### Ingredients:

5 cups water (divide the water into 4 cups and 1 cup)

- 1 family-size tea bag (or 3 regular-size bags)
- 3/4 cup sugar (or use the granulated stevia for baking, same measure of 3/4 C)
- 3/4 cup honey (my preference is to use fresh local honey)
  2 cups frozen peaches, thawed and pureed (or 2 cups fresh peaches peeled and sliced)

Optional: Have 2 additional cups frozen peaches, for serving *but do not thaw*. If using fresh, slice the peaches, lay them on a parchment-lined pan, and freeze until ready to serve. (makes a great presentation when having guests)

#### Instructions:

Bring 4 cups of water to a boil. (I use my hot pot for this step) Remove water from the heat, add the tea bag, and steep for 5 minutes. Pour the tea into a 2-quart pitcher. Set aside.

## Peach Syrup:

In a medium saucepan, combine the sugar, honey, and 1 cup of water. Bring to a boil and stir until the sugar is completely dissolved. Add the pureed peaches and return to a low boil. Remove from the heat and let cool. Pour syrup through a mesh sieve held over a small bowl. Press on the peaches to squeeze out as much of the juice as possible. Discard the peach pulp.

#### Peach Iced Tea:

Add the syrup to the peach tea, taste-testing as you go until it reaches the desired sweetness. To serve, divide the frozen peaches between 4 glasses, add ice, and pour tea over the peaches/ice.

### Hot Peach Tea:

To make Hot Peach Tea, pour the brewed tea into desired mug, add some of the Peach Syrup a little at a time to achieve desired flavor or sweetness, stir. Microwave on high for a minute and a half to 2 minutes (more if you like it really hot). Store any unused peach syrup in the refrigerator. Enjoy!
