

We are four months into dealing with a pandemic the likes of which we have never encountered. We have suspended our "normal" lives and have taken on the "new normal" of sheltering in place, wearing masks, social distancing, doctors visits by Telemed, and suspending worship services in person. Our emotions are bouncing from fear, anger, frustration, loneliness, and sadness to joy, hope, confidence, pleasure, satisfaction, and happiness and around they go in ups downs and in circles.

In the midst of such turmoil, our conversations with the Divine pretty much follow the state of our emotions at the time. The Psalms are our best resource for such a time as this. The Psalmists had similar conversations with God and we can find comfort in hearing their laments and praising of God.

Here is an example of what I'm referring to:

How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? Consider and answer me, O Lord my God! My heart shall rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord, because you have dealt bountifully with me.
- Psalm 13 (NRSV, excerpts)

There is a writers group in the UCC that is comprised of clergy and one of the things they do is write a daily devotional and send it out to anyone who wishes. The Rev. Dr. Marilyn Pagán-Banks wrote a piece called "Covid Conversations" on June 28, 2020. Her chosen scripture was the verses from Psalm 13 I listed above. The following quote is what she wrote in the "Still Speaking Daily Devotional for June 28:

Words From Rev. Carol, con't

My emotions have been all over the place these days. I'm happy one minute, frustrated and short-tempered the next. One minute I can't see beyond the disappointment, and then I witness the myriad of ways love is showing up and my spirit is lifted. Fear and hope seem to take turns leading the soulful yet erratic dance that is my emotions.

Reading Psalm 13 during this crisis, I am comforted in knowing my conversations with God are not so unique. The psalmist starts with a clear question that comes from the depth of their pain. They call God out! They call B.S. They point out the inconsistencies. They hold nothing back!

Then they catch their breath.

A heartbeat passes, followed by an exasperated shudder of release.

The conversation takes a turn.

The psalmist remembers God's love. Their trust in God is renewed. They find a new song on their lips. The music of praise and possibility resumes!

Prayer

God, thank you for your patience when our faith is spinning out of control and our emotions are not in step with what we know to be true – that you will never leave us nor forsake us. Amen.

On the days when you are confronted with news that puts your emotions in a tail spin, turn to the Psalms to find comfort in the fact that the Psalmists had the same upheavals in their lives. Their laments and ultimate praise of an ever-present God can help us put words to our emotions and conversations with the Beloved who will never leave us nor forsake us!



Debbie's Kitchen Corner



For this issue of the Beacon I chose an old favorite recipe that I have shared many years ago. It was given to me by a very dear friend almost 40 years ago at camp. I would make this recipe to bring with us on our vacation, I would always make extra to bring because we would see our friends (where I got the recipe) there every year. It's unfortunate that they had to stop going to camp due to medical reasons. I continued to set aside some for a few years after but found it difficult to get it to them. She reached out to me last year for the recipe as they had missed it so much, she had lost her original recipe due to a flood. We recently saw them and the conversation of the recipe came up. They now make it every year in May for the summer and very grateful that I had kept it safe.

So, on that note, this recipe is worth repeating to encourage making/trying it out. It's very appropriate for the summer months and for those who grill year-round no matter the weather. It keeps very well in the refrigerator. we used this homemade BBQ sauce for when we used to hold BBQ chicken suppers here at the church. For those of us still staying home and social distancing possibly trying out new recipes as I have, give this one a try. I tend to double even triple the recipe to share in mason jars when we were invited to cookouts, we got rave reviews every time.

One more good thing about this recipe is its versatility. You control the ingredients that goes into it. I recommend trying the basic recipe first then make any flavor modifications after that. Some like a smoke flavor, less sweet, others like it spicy or with a zing to it etc. The other modification can be using your slow cooker or Instant Pot, in which I have not done yet!! This recipe came about when we did not have such modern conveniences!! I love the smell it projects as it cooks in my kitchen.

Nancy's BBQ Sauce

1 cup tomato puree (or favorite ketchup)

1/4 cup white vinegar

1 cup water

1/2 cup chopped onions

1 cup sugar (brown or white)

dash of garlic powder and cinnamon


Place all ingredients in a sauce pan, bring to a slight boil, reduce heat then simmer until thick, stirring occasionally, approximately 1 ½ hours. Note: it will simmer to almost half the original volume.

Remove from heat let cool for 10 minutes then transfer into desired container, I use quart size mason jars. It is easier to transfer while the sauce is still warm. Let cool completely then store in refrigerator. The sauce will continue to thicken as it cools and is refrigerated.

Note: When grilling, it is best to pre-baste lightly with the sauce then use a heavier concentration of the sauce when almost ready to remove from
