On Sept 26 there will be a BBCC member vote on becoming an Open and Affirming Church at 11:10 am after a time for any questions.



Broad Brook Congregational Church will hold a Rally Sunday on September 12, 2021, starting at 10:00 am for the opening of the Worship Service and Sunday School. An Ice Cream Social for the whole church will follow during Fellowship Time. Covid-19 protocols will be in place, both in church and in Sunday School. Masks, social distancing, and the use of hand sanitizers are required for all un-vaccinated children/adults and encouraged for all.

In May, the children expressed that they want to learn more about Social Justice. We will use the Shine Current Curriculum that is a new curriculum for the whole church during the Fall. Adults during worship will be talking about the same bible verses, main ideas, and actions as the children are learning during Sunday School. This year we hope to have three classes plus a nursery. Beginning (Preschool-grade 2), Elementary (grades 3-7), and Confirmation class (grades 8 and up). To do this we will be looking for help from the congregation and the community. If you know any high schoolers who are looking to do community service for school requirements, we are looking for nursery care helpers and assistant teachers. We could also use adult teachers, especially those willing to substitute teach.

This fall, we will have a confirmation class for children in grade 8 and above. This class will start with a refresher course so no one will feel uncomfortable if they have missed or forgotten lessons in church.
