

Pastor's Paragraphs



Mark 4:35-41 That day when evening came, he said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other

side." 36 Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. 38 Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, "Quiet! Be still!" Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to his disciples, "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?" They were terrified and asked each other, "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!"

Jan and I are ready to bid 2023 a fond farewell.

Between falling trees, eye surgery for me, finding a new home, open heart surgery for me and pending thyroid surgery for Jan, 2023 has given us all we can handle. There is a great temptation to cry out,



Memorial Garden Brick:



(placed onto the Dovecote Pole) (Leave spaces between words and dates)



Pumpkin Bread

It's that time of year again folks! Time for everything pumpkin, my personal favorite!!! Most everyone who bakes has a good recipe for Pumpkin Bread but if you don't, give mine a try! I have had this recipe card in my recipe book for at least 40 + years and it looks it (very soiled). The recipe has never failed me in as many years I have made these loaves. I like to make extra breads to keep in the freezer for a quick last minute snack food, when company comes with short notice, or to just make my house smell good. I like my bread fully loaded with raisins and nuts but feel free to try it naked first! The bread is excellent for breakfast too. Slice the bread thick so you can toast it then put butter or cream cheese on it. Oh yum!

Ingredients:

- $3 \frac{1}{2}$ cups flour
- 2 cups sugar
- 4 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons baking soda
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground allspice
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 15 oz can pumpkin purée (fresh puree is great but make sure you strain it so it's not watery)
- 3/4 cup vegetable oil
- 2/3 cup water
- 1 cup raisins (optional)

Instructions:


Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees. Grease 2 - 9x5 loaf pans using butter or non-stick spray. You can also use 3 - 8x4 or 4 to 5 mini loaf pans instead. (don't fill pans higher than 2/3 full)

In a large bowl, whisk all the dry ingredients together, set aside.

Using another bowl, whisk sugar and oil together until blended. Add eggs one at a time mixing after each addition. Add pumpkin purée and water and mix until blended. Gradually add the dry ingredients and stir just until moistened. Stir in nuts/raisins if using. Pour batter into prepared pans.

Bake for 55-60 minutes for regular size pans or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Do not overbake as it will dry out the bread. Let loaves cool for 15 - 20 minutes in pan on wire racks then turn out onto cooling racks.

Note: The smaller loaves should be done in under 45 minutes, check on them after 30 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks to cool completely.
