



# **Baked Pasta Shells**

- 1 cup fat free ricotta cheese
- 2 oz 1/3-less-fat cream cheese, softened
- 8 oz Cabot 50% reduced fat Cheddar Cheese, shredded and divided
- 1 large egg, slightly beaten
- 16 large fresh basil leaves, chopped
- 1 clove garlic
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 16 large dried pasta shells, cooked until al dente
- 1 26 oz jar marinara sauce

# Instructions:

- 1. Place ricotta and cream cheese in a bowl and mash to gether. Stir in 1 cup shredded cheese, egg, chopped basil and garlic. Season with salt, pepper and nut meg, set aside.
- 2. Preheat oven to 400° F.
- 3. In large pot of boiling water, cook pasta until al dente, or barely tender. Drain well, making sure to empty shells of any remaining water; set aside to cool briefly.
- 4. Spread about ½ cup marinara sauce over bottom of large baking dish. Spoon ricotta mixture evenly into all the shells and arrange in dish. Pour remaining sauce over top of shells. Cover with aluminum foil and bake for 30 minutes. Uncover dish, sprinkle with remaining shredded cheese and bake for an addition al 10 minutes.
- 5. Remove from oven and garnish with fresh basil.
